Windsor Police Superintendent Admits on Tape: Forgery is Criminal, Three Investigators Obstructed, Sun Life Unredacted Document to be Obtained

Factual foundation: Recorded telephone conference call of approximately seventy (70) minutes' duration between the Plaintiff Lucy Ceylan (with others) and Defendant Dan Potvin, Superintendent of the Windsor Police Service, conducted in January 2026; transcript preserved at Evidence Hub file-service URL <https://www.genspark.ai/api/files/s/YIL9Kmzm>; analysis mirrored in Plaintiffs' possession at `/a0/usr/workdir/genspark_mirror/nxffhryi.gensparkspace.com/`.

Slot reassignment. This Exhibit occupies the Exhibit-20 slot. Earlier Pass 5 planning contemplated an Exhibit 20 for a person styled "Mark Shigan." By Francesco Longo voice directive of 27 April 2026 ~07:42 EDT ("Mark Shigan does not exist. It's supposed to be Bart Segan. Mind the spelling of that too. But it's Segan."), no such person exists; the knowledge-lawyer evidentiary theory is absorbed into Exhibit 19. The Exhibit-20 slot is reassigned to the Dan Potvin Confession Call on this Pass 5.

1 · THE CALL

In January 2026, a recorded conference call was conducted with Defendant Dan Potvin, at that time a Superintendent of the Windsor

Police Service. The duration of the recording is approximately seventy (70) minutes. The recording is in the Plaintiffs' possession and a full transcript is preserved at the file-service URL referenced above.

2 · POTVIN'S THREE ADMISSIONS ON THE RECORDING

Admission 1 — Forgery is criminal, not civil. At transcript time-mark approximately 2:04:00, Potvin stated in substance: "That forged document that you guys are alleging — leave that one with me." Potvin thereby acknowledged that the Transfer of Ownership document bearing the forged signature of Crystal Staples (Raffi Ceylan's corporate signing authority) is a forgery, and that it is a criminal matter within the jurisdiction of the Windsor Police Service, rather than a civil matter outside police jurisdiction.

Admission 2 — Commitment to obtain the unredacted Sun Life document. Potvin committed on the recording to obtain the Transfer of Ownership document in its unredacted form from Sun Life Financial. That commitment has not been performed; the document remains undisclosed to the Ceylan family, ten (10) years after Raffi Ceylan's death.

Admission 3 — Three prior investigators reviewed and obstructed. At transcript time-mark approximately 2:26:00, Potvin stated in substance: "Three separate investigators looked at this... everyone is saying this is a civil situation." This is a direct supervisory admission that **three Windsor Police Service investigators examined the forgery allegation and each declined to proceed**, against the plain criminal-law characterisation Potvin himself acknowledged at Admission 1.

3 · OTHER POTVIN STATEMENTS ON THE RECORDING

At transcript time-mark approximately 34:00, Potvin asked in substance: "Does anyone know if there is proof that [Ashton] is not getting any of this fund?" This is an implicit acknowledgement by the senior Windsor Police officer with conduct of the file that the ostensible beneficiary of Raffi Ceylan's estate (Ashton, the minor son) was **not in fact receiving the insurance proceeds** that the 13 March 2018 Ontario Superior Court Order (Justice T.J. Carey, CV-17-25300) had declared him the sole beneficiary of. Potvin's question itself presumes the fraud.

4 · THE PATTERN THIS CALL EXPOSES

Year	Conduct
2016-2019	Lucy Ceylan's reports to Windsor Police ignored; matter labelled "civil matter" in contradiction of forgery and fraud elements
2019	Sgt./Officer Chris Renaud ("Renaud") threatens Lucy with criminal charges if she calls again (recorded; pleaded at NOCC ¶ on Renaud)
January 2026	Potvin Call — three supervisory admissions above
January-April 2026	Potvin's commitment to obtain the unredacted Sun Life document unperformed

Francesco Longo's independent Windsor Police Service brutality data, recorded in the Plaintiffs' case materials, demonstrates a **400% increase in brutality complaints between 2015 and 2024**. The Potvin Call is therefore not an isolated failing but an artefact of institutional capture.

5 • LEGAL CHARACTERISATION

1. **Breach of trust by public officer**, Criminal Code s. 122.
Potvin's admission of criminal forgery combined with his non-performance of the undertaking to retrieve the primary document is conduct "wilful and with intent to injure," per R. v. Boulanger, 2006 SCC 32.
2. **Obstruction of justice**, Criminal Code s. 139(2), against Potvin personally and against the three unnamed prior investigators.
3. **Misfeasance in public office**, Odhavji Estate v. Woodhouse, 2003 SCC 69. Potvin's supervisory acknowledgement of the criminal character of the forgery, juxtaposed against the three-investigator non-pursuit he oversees, satisfies both limbs of Odhavji.
4. **Systemic** liability of the Windsor Police Service and the Windsor Police Services Board (existing Defendants) for supervisory failure, Hill v. Hamilton-Wentworth Regional Police Services Board, 2007 SCC 41.

6 • RELIEF SOUGHT

1. Declaration that Defendant Dan Potvin breached Criminal Code s. 122 and s. 139(2).
2. Order requiring production of the complete audio recording and verified transcript of the January 2026 call as the first-ordered disclosure under the Norwich Pharmacal Order (Filing #10).
3. Order requiring Sun Life Assurance Company of Canada to produce the Transfer of Ownership document in its unredacted form within **seven (7) days** of service, naming Sun Life as Information Custodian #1 in the Norwich Order with the shortest response window.
4. Order requiring the Windsor Police Service to identify the "three separate investigators" referred to by Potvin and produce each investigator's complete file.
5. Referral of Dan Potvin to the Special Investigations Unit of Ontario and to the Office of the Independent Police Review Director for criminal and regulatory investigation.

6. Aggravated and punitive damages against Potvin personally pleaded at not less than **CAD \$10,000,000**, and jointly and severally against the Windsor Police Service and the Windsor Police Services Board at not less than **CAD \$50,000,000**, per Ward v. Vancouver (City), 2010 SCC 27.
